

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| <p>English This half term they will be focusing on two key texts: The Comet and Tadpole's promise Through these texts the children will explore different text types such as letter writing, instructions, newspaper reports and poetry as well as developing their descriptive writing skills. They will write simple and compound sentences, concentrating on using full stops and capital letters correctly as well as other punctuation such as question marks and exclamation marks.</p> | <p>Phonics & Spelling, punctuation & grammar Year 1 Continue to learn new phase 5 graphemes Year 2 Continue to explore suffixes as well as alternative spellings</p>  | <p>Science – Seasonal Changes In this unit, children explore how day length, weather and the natural world change across the four seasons. They will investigate the effects of seasonal change on plants, animals and humans Children will carry out scientific enquiries including observing changes over time, identifying and classifying and recording and interpreting data. They will develop their working scientifically skills in observing carefully, asking simple questions, communicating their ideas, and sorting and comparing information.</p>  | <p>Maths Year 1 Addition and subtraction within 20- Add by counting on. Using number bonds to 10/20. Doubles. Subtracting by counting back and finding the difference. Year 2 Addition and subtraction within 100- Add by counting to the next 10 and across a 10. Subtract to a 10, from a 10 and across a 10. Adding two 2 digit numbers and subtracting two 2 digit numbers. Multiplication and division- Recognising, making and adding equal groups. Introducing the multiplication symbol. Making arrays. Grouping and sharing equal groups.</p> | <p>Geography – The World and my school In this unit, children will begin learning about space and scale by looking at their classroom location using a planned perspective of the school. Children will then look at the location of their school on its street, including some of the other key human and physical features of the area. Children will explore the location of their town within the United Kingdom and learn about the UK's four countries. They will learn about the seasons in the United Kingdom and how they change. Children will then look at where the United Kingdom is in the world, learn the names of the continents and look at weather and climate across the globe.</p> |
| <p>ART Sculpture – playful making They will explore the idea of design through making; a playful approach to exploring materials and constructing sculpture.</p> |  | <p>Birch Class Year group: 1 and 2 Year A/ Year B Term: Spring 1</p> |  | <p>Music –African call & response song Through this theme the children will be using instruments to represent animals, copying rhythms, learning a traditional Ghanaian call and response song and recognising simple notation, progressing to creating call and response rhythms</p>  |
| <p>Computing– Rocket to the Moon – Skills showcase In this unit of work the children will use the computer to make a list and be able to explain the benefits of using it for this. They will explore a basic range of tools on art software to design their rocket. They will be sequencing and following instructions to build and evaluate their rocket too.</p> | <p>PE– Gymnastics They will develop basic gymnastic actions on the floor and using low apparatus. Basic skills of jumping, rolling, balancing and travelling are used individually and in combination to create movement sequences Yoga Pupils learn about mindfulness and body awareness.
